The event opens virtually beginning Friday, June 5, with participant access to recorded lectures and hand-outs, and culminates with a live Q&A encounter among experts, conservators, and participants between 2:00–3:30 p.m. (EDT) on Father's Day, Sunday, June 21.

A Virtual Preservation Roadshow will be presented by American Ancestors | NEHGS beginning Friday, June 5, and culminating online on Sunday, June 21.

Issues of maintenance and care of items accumulated over the vears are continually of concern to those who are actively engaged in documenting a family's history. This roadshow, offered by some of the nation's leading experts in document preservation, will give solutions to common problems encountered in the process.

"Your family collections might be your closest connection to your ancestors," said Ginevra Morse, Director of Education and Online Programs for American Ancestors.

"The items they made, used, or owned can give you a much better picture of who they were, their lives, and what they considered important. Your family treasures can even help you with genealogy research, especially manuscript records like vital records kept in a Bible or other religious text, letters from family members, and documents that were issued by governments, associations, or other organizations. Preserving them for yourself and future generations is important; it is a legacy you are tasked with protecting for the next generations."

One of the features of the unique program offers participants the opportunity to submit a photo of

one item from their collection and receive advice on it from archivists and conservators. Submitted items may include photographs, albums, scrapbooks, bound volumes, born-digital or obsolete media, textiles, certificates and other documents, or other small, hand-held objects.

Participants in the Virtual Preservation Roadshow will receive:

- Access to 3+ hours of instructional video, plus handouts, articles, and templates
- Personalized advice from a qualified archivist or conservator on one family item*
 (*Note: experts will not provide monetary appraisals in this feature)
- Access to a gallery of submitted items by other participants and the expert advice they generated

- Participation in a live Q&A with instructors and a selection of submitted items for discussion
- Extended access to materials, recordings, and resources on AmericanAncestors.org until September 30, 2020.
